The Goals of the MDT

- To coordinate the activity of the various agencies involved in child protection.
- To minimize the secondary trauma experienced by child victims by reducing the number of interviews conducted and utilizing forensically trained interviewers and examiners.
- To ensure the appropriate collection of evidence and to expedite the legal process.
- To increase and diversify the information used when making decisions and to improve interagency communication.
- To guarantee that all systems work collaboratively to protect the child from further abuse.



The MDT Meeting

The Windham County MDT meets monthly to review cases of:

- Sexual abuse of a child.
- Severe physical abuse of a child.

Additional issues reviewed by the Windham County MDT include:

- Joint investigations by the Department of Children and Family Services and Law Enforcement.
- Problems with service delivery or interagency cooperation and coordination.
- Training and skill development.
