#### COUPON PROGRAM

Daily Bread Food Pantry provides dairy, juice, fresh/frozen fruit and vegetable coupons that can be used at Putnam Supermarket. Can also choose to participate in the Putnam Farmer's Market Program at the Riverview Marketplace from June through September.

#### SUMMER FOOD PROGRAM

Offered through the Putnam Public Schools and funded by the USDA, the Summer Food Program offers free breakfast & lunch to any child under the age of 18. Locations vary each year but generally meals are available at the Putnam Elementary and High Schools (breakfast & lunch) and the Putnam Public Library and the Community Room at Hampshire Heights (lunch only).

#### THANKSGIVING FOOD DISTRIBUTION

Guests are provided a gift card to purchase their own turkey at one of the local supermarkets and coupons to purchase other items for their meal. Guests who receive a home delivery will be provided with a Thanksgiving Food Basket.
